There are many of the other type of still or pot stills not likely to be taken over by the government. In these fermented liquor obtained from barley is boiled in a pot. The escaping vapor passes through a pipe where it condenses as spirit, but it is impure and has again to be distilled. The patent still is a complicated apparatus which, with the application of steam, works quickly and requires no second distillation.
