The annual report of the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto, marks a new record, despite the heavy handicap the war placed upon its work.

The task of ministering to the suffering youngsters of this province was no light one in view of the Hospital's splendid response to the national call 25 doctors and 43 nurses from its forces have seen service overses.

And yet so high has risen the cost of every item in the Hospital's budget—in abor, in fuel, in food, and, above all, in medical supplies—that the minimum expense of taking care of one thild for one day has risen from \$2.34 back in 1914 to \$3.21% in 1918. Of hat, \$1.66%—the amount per patient per day that the official Government grants do not cover—must come from voluntary contributions.

During the past four years debts vere incurred to the extent of \$100.100, which the Trustees felt assured yould be wiped out by the public as soon as the war drew to its close, and those heavy demands cease which have been made upon the generosity of the loyal people of this province. If this 43rd Christmas appeal falls to rally the friends of this Charity to its support, it will be necessary to mortgage its land, buildings and plant.
