Health of Camp Aldershot

General Condition Amongst Men is Excellent—Only Slight Illnesses.

The health of the Camp is excellent. The returns for Tuesday, 2nd show only 62 in the Field Hospital from the whole Camp. 10 from 85th Battalion, 13 from 97th; 3 from 185th; 16 from 193rd; 18 from 219th; 1 from A.S.C.; 1 from R.S.I. Of these 28 cases are measles.

Less than four weeks ago there were 160 in the Field Hospital; 31 from 85th; 25 from 97th; 11 from 185th; 46 from 193rd; 43 from 219th; 1 from R.S.I.; 2 from C.A.S.C.; 1 from C.A.D.C.; of these 45 cases were measles, principally in the 219th. The epidemic of measles has now been practically wiped out. The 185th had less than half the sickness of any other battalion in Camp. The largest amount of sickness has been in the 193rd and 219th.

There is also a noticeable improvement in the general physique and toughness of the men. Their improved physical condition is particularly shown in increasing ability of the men to stand route marching. It is exceptional now for a man to drop out of the route march at all, out of the route march at all.
