Copies of the new school regulations just issued by the Educational Depart ment have been received by the Inspector and principals of the pro-vince. Trustees' attention is directed day. The sessions will be given up to two new features affecting tural schools-text books purchased for the pupils free of cost to the parents or guardians. Any such board shall be entitled to a grant from the Provin cial Treasury equal to one half the amount expended for free text broks for the pupils. Any board contemplating taking advantage of this liberal offer from the department should communicate with the inspector at once. For the purpose of encouraging agriculture and horticulture, and also for the purpose of increasing the attractiveness of rural schools the department will make an initial grant of \$100 to any board of the trustees in a rural section where a school garden is established under the regulations of the department. A subsequent annual grant of \$10 is also provided for.


