While engaged in the deep sea fishery, the Nova Scotia banker Francis A., owned by Henry A. Amiro, of Yarmouth, was sunk about 120 miles due south of Halifax on Saturday evening by the British steamer Lord Devonshire, enroute to Belfast from Baltimore. Six of the crew of the Francis A., including Captain Percy Ross, her master, lost their lives, while the remaining fourteen were rescued by the steamer transferred to a tug off the harbor, and landed at Halifax. The disaster occurred in a dense fog.




