## PREMIER FLEMMING GETS \$5,000 A YEAR!

Premier Flemming now receives a salary of \$2,400 a year for being Premier, \$2,100 for being Surveyor-General, \$500 for being an M.L.A., besides getting an allowance for a stenographer, allowances for telephones, for telegraphing, for postage. He also gets \$24 every little while as a Commissioner of the Provincial Hospital. Besides, he is paid 10 cents a mile for traveling expenses which do not cost him a penny, as he rides on passes given by friendly railways.

Never in the history of the province has a Premier been paid a salary - not until Flemming's turn came. Not Blair, Mitchell, Emmerson, Pugsley, Tweedie, Robinson, Hazen --- not one of these, Flemming's predecessors, received a penny as salary for
