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Events of a Day In Parliament

Ottawa, June 30.—Yesterday in Parliament:—
Sir Robert Borden, on question by Hon. Mackenzie-King, said the correspondence between the Government and the British government on ships to be given Canada would be failed, unless of a confidential character. The increased indemnities proposal was discussed in the House.

Additional supplementary estimates were tabled.

In the Senate:

Amendments to bill amending the criminal code were concurred in without opposition.

The Government accepted an amendment to the pensions bill deducting from the pension the amount of salary earned by the pensioner if he accepted a position under the Crown.

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NEW PUBLIC HALL FOR MAPLE GROVE

Fine Building Erected at Prosperous Settlement in Parish of Stanley

Stanley, N. B., June 29.—Sunday last was a red letter day in the history of Maple Grove, parish of Stanley. The new hall was used for the first time, when Church of England service was held by Rev. R. A. Robinson, the rector.

Although for many years there had been talk of putting up some such building, it had not been accomplished, the only public building of any sort being the school house. The hall was erected by Mr. Robinson some time ago. The idea was taken up by the community and with this satisfying result. The building is twenty feet by thirty, which is ample for meetings and services in the settlement. There has been very harmonious co-operation among the people and a step forward is thus taken.

A Sunday school is being started at once with good prospects. A sewing circle has been in operation for the past year with fifteen or twenty members, while the men have done good work upon the building and in the hauling of materials. The land was a gift from James G. Douglass, of Stanley. Others of Stanley and Cross Creek have given some kind assistance, but the independent people of Maple Grove have done the greater part themselves. The finishing and furnishing are not quite completed, but a short time will accomplish what remains, which means if not quite sufficient, funds are in sight.

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
