DELHI.—Delhi is still held by the rebels. Our accounts extend to the 8th August. There appears to have been severe fighting on the 30th July,

the 1st, and they are reported to be really dispirited. On the 8th their powder manufactory in the city was blown up by a shell and about 500 artificers are believed to have been destroyed,

The Edinburgh subscriptions to the Indian mutiny fund exceed £5800. A great many Indian officers, ex-civilians, and medical men, are aiding the committee's exertions in collecting subscriptions.

GENERAL HAVELOCK'S COLUMN. General Havelock, after pushing on half way to Lucknow, and defeating the insurgents two or three times in the Oude provinces, was compelled by the weakness of his force, reduced by exposure, fatigue, sickness, and constant fighting,

LUCKNOW. No later news than 27th ult. from Lucknow, but by a more recent native account the garrison were holding out well, and it is believed that they have managed to lay in additional provisions.
