The Rev. Theo L. Cuyler, in a de-
scription of a visit to Carlyle, thus sket-
ches his personal appearance:—" Presently
an old man, apparently over three
score and ten, walked slowly into the
room. He was attired in a long blue
woollen gown, reaching down to his feet.
His gray hair was an uncombed mop
on his head. His clear blue eye was
sharp and piercing. A bright tinge of
red was on his thin cheek, and his hands
trembled as he took my own.

To the surprise of many, and the
disgust of not a few, President Grant
has announced that few, if any removals
from office will take place and that,
when a post in the civil service falls va-
cant the promotion is to go in the office.
This is a rule which, if fairly enforced,
must raise the American civil service
from the state of incompetency and disre-
pute into which it has fallen, and
prove a death blow to lobbying.

THE recent loss of life in St. John
Harbor, in consequence of the inefficient
condition of the life boat there, has led
Sir Harry Barrard to write a letter to
the Mayor, offering to present the city
an English life boat, with the latest im-
provements, on condition that a proper
crew and house are provided for it.
