How to Make Apple or Crabapple Jelly

Remove stem and blossom ends juice. Measure 7½ level cups (3½ from about 3 lbs. ripe fruit, and cut lbs.) sugar, and 4 cups juice into in small pieces. Add 3 cups water, cover pan and simmer 10 minutes. Crush with masher, cover pan and bring again to a full boil for ½ minsimmer 5 minutes longer. Place fruit ute. Remove from fire, let stand 1 in cheese-cloth bag and squeeze out minute, skim and pour quickly.
