Quarantine Tax.

Editor Evening Telegram. Dear Sir,—There is a quarantine tax of \$10.00 collected by the authorities from all steamers arriving at this Port from Sydney, C.B., since April last, and I understand from parties interested, that this charge on shipping is owing to the S. S. Newfoundland on arrival from sealfishery, bringing smallpox to this port, which was supposedly traced to Sydney.

It is somewhat difficult to imagine why ships from the above Port should be quarantined, while arrivals from all other Canadian Ports are exempt, but the ridiculous side of the matter is, that a local ship makes the voy-age to Sydney and back, in five or six days, and smallpox takes any time up to twenty one-days to develop.
