Commission At Genoa.

GREATEST INTEREST. (Associated Press).—None more than 1,000 persons who delegates, advisors and experts at the Genoa Economic Conference, now open here, will command public interest than the small men representing Russia, Communist statesmen, diplomats and leaders of almost every European country, are well known to the average reader for the part they have participated in assemblies and conferences. PERSONNEL OF DELEGATES. CHITCHERIN stands foremost above his colleagues of the Russian delegation as a statesman. He is a man more than 60 years of age, and began his diplomatic career during the Czarist regime. He was in England when the Bolshevik revolution started in Europe, but returned to Russia in answer to an urgent call from Lenin, who promptly asked upon him as likely material for important diplomatic work in hand. Next to Chitcherin, perhaps the most important member of the group

is Leonid Krassin, Bolshevik Minister of Foreign Trade, who was opposed to Bolshevism in 1917 but joined the Communist party after Lenin's victory. His first assignment, that of organizing the transportation system of Russia, ended in utter failure, but his efforts along other lines, particularly in securing a trade agreement with England were more successful. He is 45 years old, an electrical engineer by profession and has been referred to as the only real business man of the Soviet government.

ADOLPH JOFFE, "signer of peace treaties," headed the Soviet delegation which carried on the long peace negotiations with Poland during the fall and winter of 1920-21. He goes to Genoa as Premier of Soviet Turkmenistan. He was born in the Crimea, of Jewish parents, 45 years ago. His father accumulated a fortune as carrier of mails in road wagons before the days of railroads.

DR. JACOB JANSON, who will represent the Soviet Far Eastern Republic, is a Lett, considered obedient to the Central Executive Committee. He was sent to China to replace M. Krasnashchikov after the latter had been there six months and developed tendencies which the Soviet government considered too independent and also too favorable to the United States. He formally resided in New York, under the name of Tobolsky.

ALEXANDER SHILAPNIKOFF, Soviet Commissioner of Labor and an old leader of the Petrograd labor movement, is a metal worker, and one of the three trade union leaders appointed to the delegation. He is well known in Russia for his position as leader of the workmen's opposition which nearly caused a split in the Communist Party in 1920. Twice he has been given minor positions in the Murmansk district and at Gorny in order to keep him away from Moscow. Following his trade of metal worker, he lived in the United States, London, and Sweden, returning to Russia sometime during the war.

CHRISTIAN RAKOVSKY, President of the Ukraine Republic, a Rumanian Jew, was expelled from his country as a Socialist agitator and went to Russia in time to join the 1917 uprising. He speaks several languages including French, German, Turkish and Russian. He is regarded as intelligent, ambitious and cultured. **M. FARKHONOFF**, President of the Soviet Azerbaijan Republic, will represent the four Caucasian republics. He is a Tartar Mussulman, 55 years old and very popular at home. Until 40 years of age he was a country school teacher and then studied medicine at the University of Odessa. His entrance into politics was as a leader of the Persian revolution of 1908-09. He endeared himself to the people of the Azerbaijan republic when he repeatedly refused to sign warrants for the 5,000 or 6,000 sentences of death carried out by the Cheka at Baku after the Azerbaijan republic was taken back into Soviet Russia more than a year ago.

The delegation is completed by M. Litvinoff, Soviet Minister for Foreign Affairs; M. Vorovsky, Soviet representative in Rome; M. Midvany, representing Soviet Georgia; M. Bekzadian, representing Soviet Armenia; M. Hadjiff, representing Soviet Bokhara; M. Roudzadack, and M. Salronoff, Trade Union Leaders.
