The Investigation Committee's Report.

We find in the Hamilton Times of Friday... the report of the Committee appointed at the half-yearly meeting in October last to make a thorough investigation into all matters connected with the Road and the Company.

The Committee's enquiries embraced the three main subjects—capital, revenue and working expenses and lines of the Company. As regards capital they find that the expenditure under that head up to January last was \$8,103,736. In 1860 the capital expenditure was only \$4,902,104.

The committee draw attention to the financial position of the company as it stood in January, 1870, up to July, 1872, in order to show that, before a large addition to capital had taken place, with an increase of receipts, \$1,236,552, and an increase of working expenses, \$34,063, the dividend had grown to 5 1/2 per cent.

Mr. Edgar arrived in Ottawa on Wednesday night, and his presence, as well as that of Attorney-General Walken, who is in daily communication with the Premier, is regarded as an indication of an arrangement of the British Columbia difficulty.

The Committee, while considering their duty to condemn the manner and terms under which the arrangements between the Great Western and this Company have been conducted, regard the line itself as likely to prove of increasing value as a feeder to our system.

The report then refers to the negotiations for the working of the London, Huron and Bruce line, and explains how after the agreement was drawn up, it was not finally ratified, in consequence of the agitation in England, and in consequence of the unsatisfactory state of Great Western affairs.

After giving a full history of the relations between the Great Western and the London, Huron and Bruce line, the report deals with the office management of the Company's affairs. As regards the Canadian Board it says that the absence of clearly defined responsibility on the part of this Board operates detrimentally to the interest of the company.

The committee cannot conclude this report without declaring their belief that great changes will have to be made by those who may be entrusted with the future management. The past has been one of serious error in policy, and uncontrolled expenditure of capital.
