Canada's New Tariff.

tariff resolutions introduced in the House of Commons last night by Finance Minister Fielding:

Resolved, that it is expedient to revise and consolidate the acts and parts of acts now in force respecting duties of customs, and that for this purpose it is expedient to repeal the follow and Amend the Acts Respecting the Duties of Customs"; 58-59 Vic., chap. 23, intituled: "An Act to Amend the Customs Tariff, 1894"; 59 Vic., chap. 8, intituled "An Act Further to amend the Customs Tariff, 1894." And to provide otherwise by enacting that the following be substituted in lieu thereof:

1.—That unless the context otherwise requires (a) the initials "N. E.

S.," represent and have the meaning of the words "Not elsewhere specified" (b) the initials "N. O.
