KOCH'S LATEST FIND.

A Sure Cure for Diphtheria—Important Announcement by Dr. Edson.

NEW YORK, Aug. 24.—At a session of the State Board of Health yesterday Dr. Cyrus A. Edson gave an account of the theory and practical application of Dr. Koch's latest discovery, which he considers an absolute and infallible cure for diphtheria if applied within 36 hours after infection. It was the purpose of the health department, Dr. Edson announced, to ask from the board of estimate and apportionment a sufficient appropriation to establish a plant for the production of this infallible specific, which otherwise would be too costly to be within the means of poor people. Dr. Edson asserted confidently that if the remedy was placed in the hands of the health department it would save annually the lives of 1,500 people in this city. 67c
