> His Wife Held by the Coroner -Some Strange Stories Told by Neighbors.

Ingersoll, Oct. 12. - As the result of an inquest held by Dr. Neff, of Ingersoll, and a jury at the village of Salford last night, Mrs. William Dee is detained in the charge of Chief Wright, of Ingersoll. No charge has been lodged against her, the authorities simply saying that it is necessary to detain her in view of certain facts that were brought out concerning the death of her husband, William Dee, who died under suspicious circum-

stances this morning. Dee and his wife lived alone in a ouse about a mile west of Salford. Dee took his breakfast at 9 o'clock in the morning, and shortly after he was a number of neighbors had arrived. Death had evidently resulted from strychnine poisoning. Evidence brought Ination, declared that he had ill-used her, and Mrs. Kennedy, a neighbor, de-clared that last summer Mrs. Dee had declared that she would kill her husband if she got an opportunity. Mrs. Dee went down to Mrs. Kennedy's place when her husband took ill, and recalling Mrs. Dee's threat she imnediately asked the woman if sh Dee replied that she had no desire to do away with her husband, and denied that she had given him anything except a cup of tea, she having put the milk in and the sugar. The whole section is greatly worked up over the affair. Only two witnesses were examined at the inquest, Mrs. Dee and Mrs. Kennedy, and after the jury had conferred for a short time they decided to place Mrs. Dee under arrest. 




