RECORD PRICES
NOW FOR OATSSold as High as \$1.36
Per Cwt.TWENTY-FIVE LOADS
WERE OFFERED TODAYAnd Were Snapped Up By Buyers—
Demand Is Likely to Keep Up.

In response to the record oats prices in the local market, twenty-five loads were brought in by farmers this morning. The quotations did not drop any, however, in fact one load brought \$1.36 per cwt.

The buyers are still bidding strong and there is a demand for as much more tomorrow. The demand is very great at present, and no let-up in prices is expected for some time.

Big Demand.
"I could look after fifty loads of wheat if I had them now," one buyer told The Advertiser. "I don't care whether they are musty, discolored or anything else. We must fill the orders and the farmers are not bringing in the necessary supply."

"I am willing to pay a dollar a bushel for wheat about as good as chicken feed, and \$1.05 for good stuff. There is a keen demand for all grain, especially wheat and oats, and I do not expect any let-up."

Hides and wool prices are unchanged.

Butchers' meats were plentiful this morning, and sales were fairly brisk.

Mr. Dan McIntyre has decided definitely to ship Monday, and the price for live hogs has been fixed at \$5.75 per hundredweight. This is an advance of 25 cents per hundredweight.

Dressed hogs sold rapidly this morning for \$5.75 to \$5.90 per hundredweight. There was a fair supply.

Apples Scarce.

Apples are very scarce, and the most inferior grades were quoted at \$1.50 and \$1.75 per bag on the local square today. Sales were slow owing to the high prices. Basket lots are selling more readily.

About 50 loads of hay were on the stand, and sold from \$9.50 to \$11 per ton.
