### CIVIL WAR TALES TOLD TO LONDON GARRISON

Col. W. E. Hodgins Illustrates Modern Warfare With Some Rousing Stories of '61.

Col. W. E. Hodgins, D. O. C., delivered the fourth of a series of military lectures to the officers and men of the London Garrison in the Armories last evening. The colonel lectured on the Shenandoah Valley campaign of the American civil

Some of the fine points of the campaign as well as its defects were pointed out in he lecture. Lack of co-operation throughut had led to the statement by Lord Wolsley that from first to last the cooperation of one army corps (35,000 men) of regular or trained troops would have ven complete victory to whichever side

fought on.
The evil of civilian control, the intererence of both the union and confederate cabinets, the movement of troops and the organization of the armies was the cause of many disasters, the speaker asserted. The value of secrecy, "mystify, mislead and deceive the enemy," was one of Jack-son's maxims, and won for him many struggles. Cavalry was used throughout the campaign to gain information and to screen movements. It was pointed out how Jackson's cavalry was manouvered in a manner far ahead of his time and which as only been lately copied by the regular armies of Europe.

The great value of strategem, the battles of Kernstown, with their far-reaching results, were given as examples. Strength at the decisive point is necessary. Jackson's forces, although inferior in numbers to his opponents, in the valley was superior on the field of battle to the Federals opposed to him. The enormous value of the command of the sea by the Federals gave them a great advantage. They could prevent arms, ammunition and supplies entering the confederate states. It gave them the choice of basis from which to direct their attacks.

The value of good commanders was es-Napoleon said the man is everything, the men nothing. The confederates were numerically far inferior to the Federals; yet their armies were as skillfully directed by Lee and Jackson that for years their adversaries were kept at bay. The early victories of the confederates gave them great confidence in their leaders and themselves. Their early defeats had an opposite effect on the Federals. To the student of military art, this campaign affords an admirable example of an aggressive, defensive warfare, and one of the best instances in modern times of the degree to which skill and daring may neutralize superiority of numbers and resources. It is no wonder that the name of Stonewall Jackson as hero of this campaign is immortal.
