

RIGHT AGAINST REDISTRIBUTION BILL CONTINUES

Conservatives Talk For Hours In Opposition To The Measure.

READ FROM BOOKS

Alexander Lewis Quotes From Encyclopedia and Other Works.

Canadian Press Despatch. Toronto, April 19.—When the Ontario legislature adjourned this morning at 2 o'clock there was no sign of lifting of the blockade instituted last Monday by the Conservative opposition against the passage of the Drury U. P. O. Labor government's redistribution bill for the general elections promised for late in June.

On the other hand it was again forcibly declared by W. F. Nickle, the Conservative member for Kingston, and others on the same side of the house, that the government's proposals, not only to redistribute but also on proportionate representation would be fought to the bitter end by all constitutional means in the power of the opposition.

After three all-night sessions the members on all sides are beginning to show the physical effects of the endurance contest. The adjournment this morning was moved by J. A. Currie, Conservative, Southeast Toronto, who had occupied the floor since midnight in his second speech against the measure.

Enlivening Incident. There was an enlivening incident when Col. Currie asserted that E. J. Evans, U. P. O. member for South Simcoe, had been elected because people of the riding had believed him a Conservative. In denying this, Mr. Evans mentioned the word "lie," but retracted when the speaker sustained the colonel's demand for the same.

Alex. Lewis (Conservative, North-east Toronto) spoke for four hours and three-quarters, and ninety per cent of his speech was quotation. He read from the Encyclopedia Britannica all it contains about the struggle for responsible government in Great Britain until the time of the reform bill. Among a huge volume from which he read copiously was "How the World Votes."

He threatened to read all this book to the house, but contented himself with a few chapters. Hon. W. E. Raney objected to the use of such material in the debate, but the speaker ruled that it had a bearing on the redistribution bill.

Nickle Takes Floor. Late last evening, W. F. Nickle (Conservative, Kingston) took the floor. It was unfortunate, he said, that the redistribution bill had not been mentioned in the speech from the throne. Because it was not, the house and the country had been lulled into a sense of false security. "Rather than have an injustice done to the electors of the province, this group (Conservative) will fight to the bitter and conclusive end," Mr. Nickle pointed to the great navy debate in the House of Commons in 1892, when a member there, saying that it taught him that a well-regulated group moved by emotion such that they were willing to sacrifice everything for a cause could not be driven into submission. "That is the situation confronting us today," he said.

Hon. Manning Doherty—Are those the only emotions that make for a blockade? Mr. Nickle declared the government was stubbornly sitting by determined to break the spirit of the opposition. If I may use a slang phrase, the government intends to put through these three electoral reform bills or go broke on the job. But can it be done? There is no closure rule here.

On the government side there must be eighteen members present, on the opposition side twenty. The government cannot break the will of a minority which feels that it is committing to the redistribution bill the spectacle the prime minister is creating in the legislature today, and I think it is all due to the unfortunate remarks made by the speaker in introducing the measure when he laid down the four units principles.

Fails to Appreciate. "Those remarks may have been intended as suggestions, but I think that the prime minister sometimes fails to appreciate that what he makes as a suggestion is regarded on this side as a declaration of intent and policy. If I were a follower of the prime minister I would regard such suggestions as a declaration of intent. What I want to know is the premier determined that proportional representation shall be grafted onto this bill? If so, I am sure the committee cannot deal with proportional representation until it is passed into the separate bill, then some of the difficulty may be solved."

Mr. Drury—Unless Bill 178 (proportional representation) passes the committee has no authority to pass it in the redistribution bill. Mr. Drury contended that the committee had the power to name the ridings in which proportional representation was to be tried, but had no power to put proportional representation into force. The committee simply named the ridings.

It was on this point that Mr. Nickle differed, saying that such power was sufficient to breed suspicion for the government having a majority on the committee might have a recommendation which they could force through the house.
