

Case for Power Co.

A. E. McPhillips K. C. Presents Argument for Defendants in Water Case.

Defendant Power Co's Position In Respect to the Goldstream Lakes.

It is Expected that the Case Will Be Concluded Tomorrow.

The opening of the water works case yesterday morning marked the commencement of the argument on behalf of the defendants.

Mr. McPhillips continued his argument in the afternoon session. He contended that the right of riparian rights is a right which is not subject to the power of the state.

His Lordship referred to the fact that throughout the words "the undertaking" were used. It was questioned whether having decided upon an undertaking, another location could be decided upon.

Mr. McPhillips held that the defendants could go to the government-in-council and ask permission to appropriate all the property of the power company.

His Lordship thought that this was giving a different meaning to "undertaking" than that which applied in law. The proposed undertaking was more in line with what might be called the principle of eminent domain.

Mr. McPhillips drew attention to the fact that the power company had not been asked to give up its property.

Mr. McPhillips thought that the power company might not find it advisable to go on with the work at Shawigan Lake. They thought that the purpose of the act was to preclude the opportunity of getting water elsewhere.

RIOTS AT SHANGHAI.
