- mí' i**, *n.*; a stone or rock, *same as* mí'.
- mí' i da' ta**, *n., lit., stone heart*; a geode.
- mí' i ptsa**, *n., fr. mí' and iptsa*; an axe, particularly a stone axe. See maipsta.
- mí' i ptsa da' ka**, *n., diminutive of miipsta*; a tomahawk or hatchet, particularly a stone hatchet. See maipstada.
- mí' ká**, *n.*; a mare; as a suffix it indicates the female of all lower animals except buffalo.
- mí' ká'**, *n.*; grass; sedge; all grass-like plants.
- mí' ka' í du tsi**, *n., fr. mika' and dutsi*; a pitchfork.
- mí' ka' kí ksa**, *n., lit., Grass-fixers*; an order or degree among women.
- mí' ka' tó hi sa**, *adj., fr. mika' and tohi sa*; green.
- mí' ka' tsá ki**, *n.*; a name sometimes applied to fragrant grass.
- mí' ka' ú dsi**, *n., lit., dry grass*; hay.
- mí' ka' ú ta ku du ti**, *n., fr. mika'uti and akuduti*; a caterpillar that eats onions.
- mí' ka' ú ti**, *n., fr. mika' and uti*; onions; wild garlic.
- mí' ka za**, *n., diminutive of mí'*; gravel, pebbles.
- mí' ktá [wi-]**, *n.*; the bottom, the lower part or surface of anything.
- mí' ktá ka [wi-]**, *adv., fr. mikta*; at the lower part; below.
- mí' ktá ko a**, *adv., fr. mikta*; near or at the bottom; under.
- mí' ktá ta**, *adv., fr. mikta*; downward, in the direction of the bottom.

- mí' ma ú pa ki**, *n., fr. mí' and maupaki*; a stone-headed mullet, such as is ordinarily made by these Indians.
- mí' spá [bi spa]**, *n.*; the ash-tree.
- mí' ta pa [witapa, wita-pats]**, *v. i.*; to lie, to deceive.
- mí' ta pá dsi**, *v. i., fr. mitapa*; to equivocate.
- mí' ta pá ksa**, *v. i., fr. mitapa*; to lie frequently or habitually.
- mí' té**, *n.*; a buffalo-cow; the word is also used generically.
- mí' té a ka zi**, *n., diminutive of mite*; a buffalo-calf.
- mí' té a tá di ke [bitcatári-ke]**, *n.*; the box-elder, *Negundo aceroides*.
- mí' té a ta ki**, *n., fr. mite and ataki*; an albino buffalo, white buffalo.
- mí' té a ta ki ic ke**, *n.*; the White Buffalo Band, a secret degree or order among women of the tribe.
- mí' té ktsa tsa**, *n.*; the black currant.
- mí' té ktsa tsa a**, *n.*; the currant-bush.
- mí' té o dá lipi**, *n.*; a buffalo-hide.
- mí' ti**, *v. i.*; to creep, as a hunter approaching game.
- mí' tsá ki**, *v.*; I alone; I unaided.
- mí' tsi**, *n.*; a wedge for splitting wood.
- mí' tsi**, verbal root; mince; comminute finely.
- mí' tsi a da zi**. See Local Names.
- mí' tsí i ta mi da ksi**. See Local Names.
