A very good water color portrait by Hoppner Meyer a noted artist of that date represents a younger man than does the picture which appears on page 41. Many interesting articles have been contributed to the Historical Room by Mrs. J. E. Wilson, Toronto, the youngest daughter and the only surviving child.
