The stillness had grown oppressive, when five of the chiefs arose, and each in turn called out in his own language that Jesus was dying, was dying. A shrill mournful chant, opented over and over, and echoed from the cliffs across the river was the reply. Then, at a signal, all arose, filing past the crucifix each made a deep reverence.

After the last man had bowed, and the crowd was slowly scatter-

ing, the sky grew dark again, and the ram began to fall.—Seattle Correspondence New York Sun.
