

## JEFF WALL AT THE NOUVEAU MUSÉE LYON/VILLEURBANNE

**A** major retrospective of the work of Canadian artist Jeff Wall is being presented from March 5 to May 15. 1988 at the Nouveau Musée Lyon/Villeurbanne in France. This exhibition presents the most comprehensive collection of Wall's work ever assembled by any institution. The Nouveau Musée, Lyon/Villeurbanne is a major European centre of contemporary art and a noteworthy location for this exhibition of one of Canada's foremost artists. Wall was shown at the prestigious documenta 8 at Kassel. West Germany last summer and will be presented at the 1988 Sydney Bicentennial Biennale from May 11 to September 25 and at ROSC, an international art ehibition held every four years in Dublin, Ireland, from August 19 to October 15, 1988.
