provincial) responsible for domestic transportation, telecommunications, labour, environmental and taxation laws and regulations must review their bailiwicks with a wider, more competitive eye.

Finally, External Affairs and International Trade, if the analysis developed in this paper is even half-way correct, must increasingly focus resources on training and retaining human resources (with the concomitant financial commitments) who understand the intricacies and interconnections of the economic files and, in particular, their application to our relations in the Western Hemisphere and the Pacific Rim.
