MAY 22 LECTURE BY THE RIGHT HONOURABLE JOE CLARK,

SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS,

ON "CANADA'S STAKES IN THE NEW INTERNATIONALISM"

The Right Honourable Joe Clark, Secretary of State for External Affairs, will deliver a public lecture on "Canada's Stakes in the New Internationalism" at 8:00 P.M. Thursday May 22 in the George Ignatieff Theatre, 15 Devonshire Place, Trinity College, Toronto.

Mr. Clark will address the degree to which key international economic and political institutions, such as the UN, the GATT, the IMF and NATO, have contributed to the managing of some of the most serious international problems over the past decade. This week's events have once again focused worldwide attention on one of these institutions, the Commonwealth. In addition, he will address the relevance of some of the newer international institutions, such as the Economic Summit and the Francophone Summit, in times when multilateralism still draws fire in some quarters.
