JAMES BAY ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

Question No. 1,070—**Mr. Harding:**

1. How many environmental studies which relate to the James Bay Project and in which the government has participated, have been completed or are currently in progress?

2. (a) What is the objective of each project (b) on what date did each commence (c) on what date was the study completed or expected to be completed?

Mr. William Rompkey (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of the Environment): 1. Environmental studies relating to the James Bay Project are currently in progress in the fields of climate, oceanography, wildlife, fish, vegetation, water quality, archeology, geomorphology and biophysical mapping. One has been completed.

2. (a) The objectives of each project are: 1. To establish baseline data with which to assess the impact of development in the James Bay area of Quebec on the environment. 2. To enable recommendations to alter the design, construction or operation of the development, as required, to protect the environment. (b) All studies began in the late summer and fall of 1971. (c) One project on Ice Accretion on Structures was completed in December, 1972. All other studies except those of a monitoring nature are scheduled for completion by March 31, 1976. It is expected that interim results for specific areas will be available earlier and certain migratory bird studies will be completed in 1974.
