mammals, while demonstrating Canada's expertise in the fishery sector and stimulating the general interest of the public. We estimate attendance at 1.1 million visitors during the first year. That is a lot of people!

By giving visitors an insight into various conditions in our environment, our conservation practices and Canada's water resources, we can teach them to protect the environment and to show respect for our ecology.

The museum would of course be associated with well-known scientific institutions and maintain close relations with research centres, colleges, universities and other educational establishments.

There is much material available to those who are interested in this subject. In looking over the material, I was interested by the Scripps Aquarium Museum in La Jolla, California. It is an interesting example of an aquarium—museum. Founded in 1905 and affiliated with the University of California in San Diego, the institute has an extensive collection of marine animals. It specializes in the study of infections contracted by aquatic fauna, aquariology and pigmentation research. They publish a quarterly newsletter and were very proud to associate themselves with the twenty–fifth anniversary of the University of California at San Diego with a special edition of that quarterly newsletter.

Mr. Speaker, here in the National Capital region, the issue of financing and relations with educational institutions has been given very serious thought. A study started in July 1988 by the National Capital aquarium committee shows it would be economically, financially and socially feasible to build and operate this kind of aquarium. The project I favour and endorse would become financially self–supporting and could be directed by a non–profit organization. Self–financing would be based on admission fees, private investment —the municipality selected would also invest a certain amount—, membership fees, donations, product sales, franchises, special events, funding campaigns, and other sources.

The Vancouver Public Aquarium, which is a similar project, makes an annual profit.

Although a substantial financial contribution from the federal Government is expected and would be desirable, a minimum contribution might include the gift of a lot of at least 20 acres plus the expertise the government has among its employees.

Mr. Speaker, we have some major human resources in both science and technology, in aquatic sciences and research that has been done by our scientists in this field, and I think this would be a major contribution on the part of the federal Government in setting up the museum.

As for cost and economic spin-offs, construction costs are estimated at about \$51 million, while the total start-up cost would be \$67,721,000. However, total economic spin-offs during the first year of operations would amount to \$204 million. It would create 1,752 jobs during construction and thus fill the void left with the completion of the National Gallery and Museum of Civilization; as well, 150 permanent jobs would be created in this new museum.
