WHEN WILL THEY MEET?

British Ships Are After German Cruisers in Mediterranean.

LONDON, Aug. 9.—Sea power, or command of the sea, may be exercised without the main fleets becoming engaged at all. They may affect their object by what Rear Admiral Mahan calls noiseless or static force, so long as the German fleet is placed in such circumstances that

fleet is placed in such circumstances that it must either remain in port under the shelter of fortifications, and its screen of destroyers, or risk fighting at manifest disadvantage.

These conditions may continue to rule. Meanwhile the theatre of war is closed to German merchant shipping. The long lists of captures of German merchantmen appearing every day are evidence of the exercise of sea pressure.

Nothing in the shape of food can enter Germany by sea. Her seaboard supplies of every kind are stopped. Cessation of her trade and commerce and the consequent scarcity will presently have an effect upon her population generally, also upon the provisioning of her huge military forces.
