ANOTHER DECLINE IN HOGS RECORDED

Prices Fell Quarter to Half a Dollar at Union Stock Yards.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Thursday were 64 carloads, 2485 hogs, 1273 sheep and lambs, and 63 calves.

The quality of the fresh arrivals of cattle was no better than what has been on the market all week, and prices unimproved; in fact, there were many bargains for those who bought, especially in the feeder classes.

On the other hand, the drovers as a rule lost thousands of dollars during the past week.

Stockers and feeders were cheaper yesterday than in many weeks, yet, in months.

Milkers and springers of good to choice quality, that is, fresh milkers and forward springers, but late springers, of which there are too many coming, were slow of sale, as they are wanted.

Veal calves, sheep and lambs were about steady, but hogs were down 25 to 50 cents per cwt. lower, it looks like a seven-cent drop this coming week.

Butchers' Cattle-- Good steers sold at 77.25 to 77.75; medium, 77.00 to 77.50; good cows, 76.50 to 77.00; good cows, 76 to 76.50; canners, 75.50 to 76.00; bulls, 75 to 75.50.
