

HOME RULE FOR SURE IN EIGHTEEN MONTHS SAYS WM. REDMOND

**Lords May Delay Bill's Passage, Declares Irish Leader's
Brother, But Their Power to Kill it is Gone—More
Liberty in England Than Any Time in History
—Ireland's Prosperity Will Be That
of Canada and Australia.**

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—(Special.)—Before Christmas the Irish home rule bill will pass the house of commons by a probable majority of 100, and within eighteen months the bill will be law in force.

This was the prophecy made at the Hoffman House yesterday by William R. C. Redmond, M.P., brother of John R. Redmond, leader of the Irish party. Mr. Redmond has come to this country to attend the convention of the United Irish League in Philadelphia next week, and to make speeches in other cities.

"Home rule now looks as though it were a certainty," said Mr. Redmond, in the course of shaking hands with scores of Irishmen who crowded the lobby of the Hoffman House.

"The passage of the Parliament Act last year, which shears the house of lords of its power to thwart the will of the masses of voters, has cleared the way for home rule bill. By Christmas the bill will pass the lower house. The chances are that the government will keep its majority of 100 intact on this question."

Lords' Opposition of No Avail.
When the bill will go to the upper house, which, by the way, was the work of the Irish party.

"Under that act the bill will return to the house of commons. The house will again pass the measure and it will again probably fall of adoption by the lords. Then the house will once again pass the bill, and at last home rule will be a fact."

"The Parliament Act makes this result possible by declaring that a bill which has been passed three times by the house of commons at three sessions within two years.

"All indications are that the government will retain power for at least another eighteen months. By that time the bill will have been passed the necessary three times, despite the hostility of the house of lords."

"Home rule will mean wonderful things for Ireland both as to the commercial life of the country and the spirit of the people. Under it Ireland will jump ahead as all other lands have done to which freedom has been granted. The prospect of Canada and Australia will be the lot of Ireland."

The Situation in Ulster.
"Despatches which have appeared in this country indicating that there is intense hostility to the home rule bill

in the whole of Ulster, and that there might be civil war there over the measure have greatly exaggerated conditions. I would like to clear up the Ulster situation in the minds of Americans.

"The facts are that only in the north-eastern part of Ulster there is any opposition to home rule. All Ulster would show it to be equally divided on the question. Out of the 108 members of the Irish party in parliament only nineteen are opposed to home rule. Seventeen of this opposition comes from the north-eastern Ulster.

"The people of the disaffected portion of Ulster have a very shrewd sense as to what is to their own advantage. They realize fully that it is the emphatic desire of all national Ireland to treat minorities with the utmost fairness. I think there will be very little bitterness."

"I have had seven years' experience as member for an Ulster constituency. I can say without the slightest hesitation that the opposition and excitement in connection with home rule were infinitely greater in 1886 than they are today. The point at issue, of course, is chiefly a religious one, northeastern Ulster being largely Orange."

"The Orangemen fear that they will not have sufficient power under home rule. However, it may be set down as a fact that a considerable number of Protestants are now in favor of home rule."

England's First Real Liberty.
"As far as England is concerned, the English people today are enjoying real liberty for the first time in the history of the nation. The parliament act is the explanation, and that measure has brought the most far-reaching change since the days of Oliver Cromwell."

"The old house of lords is as dead as Julius Caesar. The lords now cannot destroy legislation which gives effect to the wishes of the masses of Englishmen. They can now only delay such measures. The parliament act has taken rank in history with Magna Charta and the Bill of Rights."

"I have recently been traveling thru Great Britain. Everywhere I have found the masses in favor of home rule. The English voters want the Irish question settled once and for all. The admirables results attained in South Africa with the Boers under a home rule policy have greatly increased the wish of the English masses to give Ireland what it wants."

"England is very sensitive to American criticism. The English voters want the United Irish League convention will show England that Irish-Americans are a unit in favor of home rule. I will address the meetings which I will address in other cities will show England that Americans are for the bill."

"Dr. Speer and Home Rule": A Reply to Mr. O'Connor

Editor World: Mr. Garrett O'Connor of Bridgeburg, Ont., has done me the honor of making reply to the report in The World of a sermon preached by me on Sept. 15.

"Dr. Speer tells us that home rule is not the solution of the Irish problem." Now Mr. O'Connor, I must repeat what I said in the sermon, for to those who are unprejudiced, nothing is more certain than the above statement. Mr. O'Connor's reply that 28 out of 28 counties of Ireland send home rule representatives, and some from Ulster, too, is no sound reason for withdrawing what I have declared. Mr. O'Connor might as well have said that the fact that the home rule bill has passed the commons is no reason for withdrawing what I have declared.

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Read History.
It is amusing to hear a Roman Catholic tell of the union of the year 1800, being "unnatural" and brought about by "bribes for fat purses." Why has my friend taken the pains to read the history of the movement which resulted in the union of the year 1800? The fact is that 300,000 Protestants were opposed to the union bill, and almost the entire Roman Catholic population followed the bishops and priests in voting in favor of union with England. The Roman Catholics of Waterford, Cork, Wexford, Tipperary, Cahir, Kerry, Roscommon, Leitrim, Monaghan, Longford, Dundalk, New Ross, and Limerick voted against the union. The English voters want the Irish question settled once and for all. The admirables results attained in South Africa with the Boers under a home rule policy have greatly increased the wish of the English masses to give Ireland what it wants."

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Will Resist It.
People in the north of Ireland, he declared, were resolved not to accept home rule. They were convinced, he said, that their liberties and faith would be imperilled, that financial injury would result, and that the system of education which had worked well for two centuries would be changed.

"What they desired, he said, was that both people should live together as brethren with equal rights and that there should be such harmony there as might exemptly to the world that it was not a monarchy but righteousness which exalted a nation."

In conclusion, the preacher asked the congregation for their sympathy and prayers for Ireland. He had no doubt, he said, that the English people would be convinced, and that the system of education which had worked well for two centuries would be changed.

"The church was crowded to the doors and hundreds were unable to gain admission. On the platform were Ald. May, Dr. Conboy, Deputy Mayor Rowe of the first district, and Worshipful Master Hawkins, and the pastor, Rev. J. D. Morrow. The Clark Wallace O. L. marched to the church 200 strong, headed by their file and drum band."

Mr. McBrath pointed out that in Ireland there were over one million Protestants who were practically unanimous in their opposition to home rule. The great reason for this was, he said, because they considered such a measure unfavorable to their civil and religious liberty. It would result in the Protestant members to the Dublin parliament constituting a permanent minority, and hence they would be outvoted by those whose ideals and methods were different. The educational ideals of the two peoples were different, he declared, and the Protestants had already suffered from the country by the technicality which virtually excluded them from the National university. In this institution Gaelic was made a compulsory subject on the matriculation, and the language, he declared, was as foreign to the north of Ireland people as the North American Indian tongue to a Canadian."

A. O. H. Would Be Boss.
From a national standpoint, he believed that an Irish legislature would be injurious to the state and might in the time of a crisis to the empire be a danger. Home rule would mean, he said, that Ireland would be put in the hands of men who were unskilled in the business of a government. A Dublin parliament would be largely influenced by the Ancient Order of Hibernians, which organization, he declared, had a close connection with lawlessness and outrages. Even today such crimes as cattle driving had not been denounced by the leaders of the home rule party. The A. O. H. had tremendous influence and would practically control the politics."

According to Mr. McBrath the home rule measure of Gladstone would have resulted in financial disaster and the present measure was calculated to produce the same effect. Financially, he said, the A. O. H. of commerce were unanimous in their denunciation of the bill and even the agitation for an Irish legislature had lowered the market value of stocks millions of dollars. The preacher named the 22 states which had suffered bankruptcy and out of this number not one was Protestant."

Program of Dancing, Drills and Parades.

"I am an Irishman; I have a right to speak of the Roman Catholics. On equality and toleration in the fullest sense of those terms. I condemn the policy to which our priests have now committed themselves in the plenitude of their power in Ireland."

"It is not a policy of forbearance, but of religious intolerance and bigotry which ultimately bound to develop into religious persecution, and is destined to eventuate either in revolution or in the undermining of the individual and corporate morality, in the emasculation of our people's character, and in the ruinous warring of national decline."
