


## QUEER INSECT. Ant-Lion Bores Holes in Prey and Pumps It Dry. There is probably no man in the vicinity of Boston who has had more queer pets than Charles J. Maynard of Newton, and his observation of

these animals has served to make him more than usually well acquainted with the habits of many wild creatures. One time he spoke of his pet owl, which had such a range of vision that it would give its cow cry for a cow so far dis-tant that Mr. Maynard could but just see it as a red speck, and at the same moment would take dainty tidbits from moment would take dainty tidbits from his hand.
