And whereas the detention of these unfortunate creatures with the crim-inal class in the common fa<sup>3</sup> is not the humane way of providing for the insame, which is contemplated by the laws of the province: And as such detention of the insame in the jail not only increases the cost of jail maintenance, but thru over-crowding prevents a much better class-ification of the prisoners confined therein: Mr. Lobb of the City Legal Departmen asked the committee to consider the mai ter of freight carrying. So far as he could discover the Toronto Hailway Company has no right to carry freight, but might be giv-en that right by the City Engineer. 
