LORD PAUNCEFOTE'S REMAINS

Arrived at Southampton Yesterday
on U.S. Cruiser Brooklyn.

Southampton, Eng., July 14.—The United States armored cruiser Brooklyn (from Annapolis July 1), having on board the remains of Lord Pauncefote, late ambassador of Great Britain at Washington, arrived here this morning. The body was landed soon after 11 o'clock.

Full naval honors were paid to the remains of Lord Pauncefote. His widow followed the coffin from the wharfbank to the train which started for New York-Trent (near Nottingham), where the funeral will take place tomorrow.

The ceremony of the transfer of the remains was impressive. A hundred and twenty-four blue jackets composed the bearers party. The coffin was taken between lines of soldiers who arms reversed to a specially draped railroad carriage. During the removal of the body the American and British flags played the Chopin funeral march.

Besides the widow and the family, Rear Admiral Joseph B. Coghlan, the officers of the Brooklyn, the United States Consul, John E. Hopley, a number of British naval officers and the mayor of Southampton followed the coffin to the train. Minute guns were fired by the Brooklyn and the British warships until the departure of the train.

STOVE FOUNDERS ARE HERE

Will Make an Appeal to the Iron Moulders To-day for More Apprentices.

NO HOME FOR AGED AND DISABLED

But the Convention Will Consider Increasing the Fund for Sick Benefits.

During the sessions of the Iron Moulders' Association today managers of several of the biggest stove manufacturing concerns in the world will address the delegates on the question of permitting an increase in the number of apprentices throughout the country.

For this purpose a delegation arrived from the States last evening. It is composed of two of the officers and executive board of the Stove Founders' National Defence Association of North America. This is the organization of manufacturers, and every firm in the organization controlled by the Union Moulders' membership.

The delegates who arrived last night are: C. H. Castle, president of the association, and president of the Comstock-Castle Company of Quincy, Ill.; J. Dwyer of the Michigan Stove Co. of Detroit, Mich., one of the largest manufacturers of stoves in the world; Henry Cribben, Cribben & Sexton Company, Chicago, and Thomas J. Hogan, secretary of the S.F.N.A., with headquarters at Chicago. The delegates are quartered at the Queen's. They come prepared to make a strong fight with the moulders' convention to secure a change in the present system of employing helpers for moulders.

This morning a committee from the moulders' convention will wait on the delegates from the manufacturers. This committee will be the one to which all apprentices' affairs are referred by this convention. After a lengthy discussion of the situation, when they will be invited to address the convention. These addresses will be made in the afternoon, and the managers of the big concerns are prepared with all kinds of arguments to show where it is to the general advantage of labor, if not specifically to the advantage of the Iron Moulders' Union, to favor the plan the manufacturers are trying to introduce.

To this end they will argue that where the present scale allows one apprentice to each foundry, and one more for every eight moulders and fractions thereof, the increased business easily warrants increasing this number, as to nearly double the number of apprentices now employed.
