HELD OVER GAS JET

Bridant Accused of Inhuman Treatment of Child.

Kington, July 23. — "Look at that child's arms," said Mr. Ernest J. Villard, father of Mrs. Bridant, who died in Toronto on Friday, as the 18-month-old girl toddled into the room in the Villard home on Place d'Armes, where its mother lay still in death. "Those marks are where its inhuman father burned its flesh by holding it over a gas jet. Its arms are still sore and there on its neck is a burned patch, too. Anyone who would defend Edmund Bridant is no man." Mr. Villard spoke in a quiet and firm way, as he sat beside the coffin which contained the mortal remains of his eldest daughter. Bridant is held at Toronto for the murder of his wife.

FELL INTO CANAL.

He was in the act of getting in his canoe when he slipped, he lost his footing and took a splash in the canal. Fortunately there was a number at hand to assist in the rescue and the minister was hurried home in a cab, suffering nothing beyond a ducking.

SAVED BY BABY CARRIAGE.

Newport, R. I., July 23. — Joseph G. Anthony, a well-to-do young farmer of Easton, son of State Representative Henry C. Anthony, his wife and their 4-year-old daughter Evelyn, were drowned in Narragansett Bay this afternoon, while the family were enjoying an outing. Their infant daughter was saved in a remarkable way. She was found floating in her baby carriage, which was supported by two oars which got caught in the wheels. The baby did not even get wet.
