64 CARS AT CITY YARDS TRADE FAIR FOR GOOD

Prices Rule About the Same—Hogs Steady—Sheep, Calves, Lambs, Firm. Receipts of live stock at the City Market, as reported by the railways, for Wednesday and Thursday, were 64 cars-loads, composed of 500 cattle, 809 hogs, 569 sheep and lambs, with 99 calves.

Chicago Cossip. Marshall, Spader & Co. wired to J. G. Bealy at the close. Wheat has been extremely nervous, with a large volume of trade, much of it consisting of several weeks' past and accumulated tempting profits.






