

PRINCE ALBERT.

The Rev. Jas. Sieveright of Goderich was unanimously appointed to Prince Albert for three years at a salary of \$1200 per annum and travelling expenses to the field. Mr. Sieveright, being communicated with by telegram, accepted the appointment. It was agreed to pay Mr. Sieveright immediately \$250 on account of travelling expenses, and to ask the Manitoba Presbytery to report to the next meeting of the Committee what in their opinion is a reasonable amount to allow for travelling expenses to Prince Albert.

SUPPLY OF OTHER FIELDS.

The supply of Palestine, Beautiful Plains, Dominion City, &c., was remitted to the Sub-Committee.

The following resolution was adopted :—

“The General Assembly having enjoined the Home Mission Committee to equalize the revenue and expenditure of the fund each year, the Committee, after careful consideration of the claims of the work, find that \$35,000 is the lowest sum with which the work can be efficiently carried on for the current year. They have made grants and assumed responsibilities to this extent in the confident hope that the required amount will be obtained, and they earnestly appeal to the Presbyteries and Sessions of the Church to use all diligence to secure liberal contributions to enable the Committee to meet their liabilities and end the year free from debt.”

Messrs. Bruce (Convener), Dr. Cochrane, King, Laing and Warden were appointed to draft for the March meeting an expression of the mind of the Committee as to the propriety of the General Assembly making a strong representation of the great extent and peculiar claims of the Home Mission work in the North-West to the Churches in Britain.
