Dear Sir:-

Have visited C. W. Cox's operations on Indian Reserve #28. (LaSaul), and during the past three days have learned the following:-

There are about 30,000 or 35,000 ties left in the bush on roads, and 2000 or so not skidded. An estimate of 80,000 at landing.

Clerk is gone. No records here. Foreman Fishuk here with two men. He contemplates staying here until the drive.

There has been no burning of bush, and from what I have observed a serious fire hazard has been created, and a great deal of waste. A matter I will fully dwell on in my report, later.

Boom timber was cut by the licensee and brought to the landing from the Kenora's operations. Gordon, I believe, has scaled these.
