

## MURDER COUNT GOES TO JURY

Goder, Nov. 4 (CP).—Given the cases of Sam Dodge, charged with murder, and Lorne Jardine, who faces a manslaughter count, the Grand Jury at the Fall Assizes, which opened this afternoon before Mr. Justice Urquhart, will report at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning.

Dodge, an Indian, is alleged to have killed James Kilpatrick by hitting him on the head with an axe in the Dodge home, near Exeter, on June 20 of this year.

Jardine, a merchant's son, of Ethel, Huron County, was the driver of a car in which two teen-aged Gorrie girls, Betty Edwards and Ida Ritchie, were killed in an accident July 7 last.

A dangerous-driving charge against A. Garon, Clinton knitting factory manager, was traversed to the General Sessions in December at the request of W. B. Common, K.C. Garon was the driver of the car which struck down and injured Frank Fingland of Clinton on No. 4 Highway last March as Mr. Fingland sought to flag the Garon car in a blinding snowstorm.
