SPECIAL DAY IN CITY CHURCHES

Soldiers Here Paraded to Three Services on Sunday Morning

Graves of Soldier Dead Decorated—Sons of England Have Memorial Service

The city churches on Sunday observed both Thanksgiving and Armistice Day with special services. Church parades were held by the militia units, cadets in the morning, and in the afternoon the G. W. V. A. and the L. O. D. E. combined for a decoration day service.

There was a large turnout of the militia and cadets at the morning church parade, the Protestants going to Trinity and the Catholics to the Cathedral. On the return march the salute was taken by Col. W. B. Anderson, C. M. G., D. S. O., at the west side of Queen Square. The service in Trinity was conducted by Rev. C. G. Lawrence, assisted by Rev. C. J. Markham. In the afternoon the Sons of England held their annual memorial service in St. Mary's church. The service was conducted by Rev. R. T. McKim, and the sermon was preached by Rev. C. G. Lawrence.

DECORATION DAY. Despite the rain during the afternoon the decoration day programme of the War Veterans and L. O. D. E. was carried out in Fernhill cemetery. Following the service wreaths were placed on the Memorial and the graves.

At the New Catholic cemetery the Veterans' party placed a wreath on the Memorial Plot and decorated with the single poppies also. Rev. Wm. Duke was the speaker at this service, and the Last Post was sounded by Trumpeter Hugh Yearwood.

The Carleton branch of the G. W. V. A. took part in the church parade in the morning, and in the afternoon decorated the graves of their fallen comrades in Cedar Hill, Holy Cross and Greenwood cemeteries, after which they visited the D. S. C. R. hospital, Lancaster.

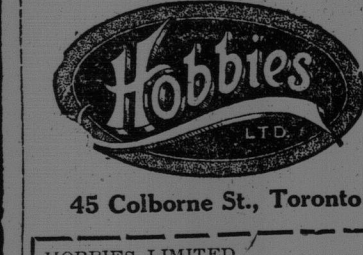

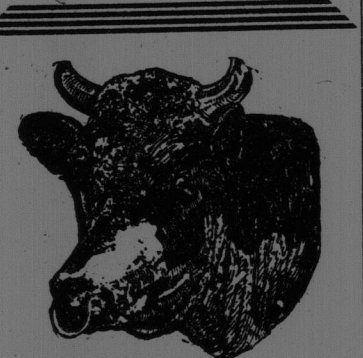
