

No Effort Will be Spared To Find Inhuman Murderer

City Offers Reward For Location of Man Who Caused Death of Sadie McAuley; Inquest is Opened

Many rumors were afloat last evening that the murderer of little Sadie McAuley had been apprehended, but all proved groundless. A young man answering the description is said to have been seen in a number of places, and the detective force and policemen are investigating them, hoping that sooner or later they will succeed in apprehending him.

A new and important description of the man was handed to the police yesterday by little Phyllis Wilson, daughter of Thomas Wilson, of 120 Chesley street. This little girl told a Telegraph reporter last evening that she had accompanied Marion Logan and Freddie Logan on a raspberry excursion on the morning of Tuesday, Aug. 2, the day on which the little McAuley girl disappeared. She said that they had left her house about 11:15 and had proceeded up Bentley street to the vacant lot almost directly across the avenue from the street. She said that about 11:30 her brother Cyril, who had been picking berries there earlier in the day, met her and stayed with the three of them for a few minutes.

15TH OF SERIES OF ITALIAN MURDERS

Another Killing in Vendetta Planned in Inner Cabal of "Whiskey Curb Market."

New York, Aug. 10.—Working on the theory that the murder had been ordered by some inner cabal in an Italian "whiskey curb market" in Cherry street, detectives are attempting to reconstruct the details of the shooting of an Italian on Saturday night on the links of the Jackson Heights Golf Club, between Goodside and Kibbure's L.L. The body was identified as that of Joseph La Monica, of 142 Cherry street, formerly a fruit dealer.

The police count this as the fifteenth of a series of murders attributed to an Italian feud or vendetta that had its origin in bootlegging activities. Although the police as yet have no definite evidence to support their theory, they point out that it is certain that some strong force had been organized and that it was not an Italian settlement and far from any habitation where he might have legitimate business. TRY TO PROTECT BULGARIAN LEVA

Normally Five to the Dollar, Rate is Now 125—Curb Speculation in Exchange.

Sofia, July 28.—(A. P. by Mail.)—A steady depreciation of the Bulgarian leva is causing anxiety in stock circles and the government is taking coercive measures to curb speculation in exchange. Heavy fines and even jail sentences will be imposed on any one dealing in the exchange of the leva. The Bulgarian leva before the war was worth about the same as the French franc, or about five to the American dollar. During the war the dollar at one time reached a value of fifty to the leva, and now an American dollar is worth 125 leva.

TROOPERS TOOK CHIEF PRISONER

Police Official Tried to Quell Trouble Between Soldiers and Civilians.

(Montreal Gazette.) As the result of a clash between state troopers from Roules Point and Chief of Police Medas Tremblay, of Champlain N. Y. Saturday night, the chief of police was arrested by the state troopers and taken to Champlain at 10:30 o'clock. The chief of police claims that he acted in self defense, alleging that his life was in danger. According to the information secured from Chief of Police Sabourin, of Roules Point, state troopers who were in Champlain at 10:30 o'clock on Saturday night, quarreled with two civilians in a barber shop. After some argument the troopers told the civilians to be quiet and Chief Tremblay entering the place tried to quell the disturbance by saying that anything amiss would be settled by him, as he was the chief of police of the place. One of the troopers is said to have drawn a revolver and pointed it at the chief, who seized the soldier by the throat and forced him to replace the gun in his pocket. A crowd soon gathered and threatened to harm the troopers, who hastily retreated. They returned with several comrades shortly after midnight, and finding Chief Tremblay alone on the street, took him prisoner and brought him to Roules Point where he was held on a charge of assault. He was allowed out on bail of \$200 yesterday morning, and will appear before Judge Gittys in the municipal court this morning.

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NICARAGUANS INTERESTED IN WESTERN WHEAT

Proposal to Produce on Extensive Scale—Will Probably Aggregate 30,000 Acres

Saskatoon, Sask., August 10.—Paul D. Sheridan O'Leary, of San Sebastian, Nicaragua, who passed through here recently, said he had been commissioned by South American capitalists to inquire into and report fully upon a proposal to produce wheat on an extensive scale in western Canada, areas that will probably aggregate 30,000 acres or more.

Mr. Sheridan said that his principal aim was to produce wheat in the staple product of wheat is worth trying. "But they first want certain data," he continued. You see these people, practically all of us in South America, and the adjoining portions of South America are in coffee and sugar extensively. CANADA TO OPEN CHILLED BEEF MARKETS IN ENGLAND

London, July 22.—(Canadian Press by Mail.)—The first consignment of Canadian chilled beef to come to this country is expected to arrive next week. The meat, which is shipped from Montreal, will be placed on sale at once in the London, Liverpool and Manchester markets. Hitherto Argentina has been the largest exporter of chilled beef to Britain, and if the present Canadian experiment meets with success, the chilled beef trade is likely to become one of Canada's important industries, says the Times.
