Food Producers Decrease.

Hoard's Dairyman estimates that the forthcoming census in the United States will show sixty-five per cent of the population living in large urban centres and only thirty-five per cent in the country and in urban centres of less than \$500 people. Since there are a large number of these smaller urban centres, the proportion of food producers will be a good deal less than thirty-five per cent of the total population, and it is estimated that every farm in the United States, great and small, must, on the average, produce food for fifteen people.

Thirty years ago seventy per cent of the people of the United States lived in the country or smaller urban centres, and even so recently as ten years ago forty-six per cent of the population of the republic was found there.
