Canada In The War Newsy Notes of Activities in Many Parts of Dominion

It is announced that Ontario will contribute half a million dollars in some form to the Imperial government. A citizen of Victoria, who has just arrived in Montreal, says he never saw such an outburst of patriotism as he witnessed in Victoria and Vancouver.

On Thursday last 675,000 bushels of grain were loaded at Montreal into ships about ready to sail for England. During the week ending August 20, 42,851 sacks of flour, 1,842,724 bushels of wheat and 144,126 bushels of oats were exported from Montreal for ports in Great Britain.
