Moral and Social Reform Council

Committee to be Heard

A delegation from the Moral and Social Reform Council is preparing to go before the local government on February 23 in session in this city to ask for some definite amendments to the liquor license act. These amendments, in some cases, are very important and far-reaching, while others of them are of lesser consequence, but nevertheless interesting. The delegation to go before the government will be composed of A. A. Wilson, K. C., J. Willard Smith, Rev. W. R. Robinson, and J. S. Armstrong. One matter is that of inspecting liquor.
