

# STEAMER TURNS TURTLE IN THE LAKE STORM

(Continued from page 1)

The gale of Sunday reduced the Port Huron lite saving boat house to wreckage and with it went all of the lifeboats in service here. For this reason Captain Plough could not man a boat this afernoon to go to the assistance of the vessel. "I have no doubt that every man aboard the vessel is drowned," said Captain Thomas Reid. "My men have reported that the steamer is a total wreck that she is turned turtle, and that her stern is completely submerged."

Searching parties from Sarnia are proceeding up the lake shore to a point near where the wreckage was sighted. The shore will be searched in an effort to obtain some trace of the steamer. The vessel lies in about sixty feet of water.

Calumet, Mich., Nov. 11—In the face of a fifty mile gale, shifting from northeast to northwest, on Lake Superior last night, fear was expressed for the safety of the crew of twenty-three men aboard a steamer stranded on Gull Rock off Manitou Island. The life saving crew after a three hours' battle with the heavy seas, a stiff wind on shore and a snow storm, failed to get to the steamer last night, principally because they are not equipped with a power boat. Another effort will be made today.

Sault Ste Marie, Mich, Nov. 11—Down bound steamers continue to arrive heavily iced after the fierce storm which is sweeping over the lakes. The Superior last evening reported a Tomlinson line steamer sunk off Gross Cape Point. Another big steamer still unidentified was reported aground on Point Iroquois last night.


