SIGNALS AT CITADEL HILL.

EXPLANATION OF SIGNALS made on the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill Halifax, when Vessels are seen from the Citadel, or reported from an Out-Post.

one square rigged vessel One ball close up. - two square rigged vessels One ball half hoisted, three square rigged vessels Two balls close, Two balls separated, - four square rigged vessels five square rigged vessels A Pendant of any colour, A Pendant under a ball, six square rigged vessels - - seven square rigged vessels A Pendant over a ball, eight square rigged vessels A Pendant under 2 balls close, nine square rigged vessel A Pendant between 2 balls, ten or more square rigged vessel A Flag of any colour, A Cylinder close up at the inner haulyard, a Steamer.

A Cylinder half hoisted at the inner haulyard, two or more Steamen The above balls, &c., are hoisted at the East or West yard-arm, as cording to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When vessels are reported from an Out Post, the following Signal are shewn under the yard-arm as repeats:-

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner haulyard, close up.

A Ship or Barque, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at the inner haulyard.

A Brig, a small ball at the end of the yard, and a large one at the in ner haulyard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer haulyard; two or more a cross half hoisted.

A Schooner, a cross close up at the inner haulyard.; two or more a cross half hoisted.

A Steamship or Barque, a large ball at the outer, and a cylinders the inner haulyard close up.

A Brig, Brigantine, or Schooner rigged Steam Vessel, a small balls the outer, and a cylinder at the inner haulyard close up.

When the description of vessel in sight is ascertained from the Cit del, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head A Union Jack, a Flag Ship.

A Union Jack with a Red Pendant over it, a Two Decker. A Union Jack with a Blue Pendant over it, a Frigate.

A Union Jack with a Blue and White Pendant over it, a Ship Barque rigged Sloop-of-War.

A Union Jack with a White Pendant over it, a brig rigged Sloop-of War.

A Union Jack with a Red and White Pendant over it, a Schooner, Cutter-of-War.
