XII. That Eatonville, in the township of Normanby, betaken up as a new Mission, and that a preacher be stationed thereon.

XIII. That the Cayuga Circuit be divided: and that Cayuga, Wilson's, Decewsville, Balmoral, Forest's, Hullsville, Husband's, Jarvis, and Lawson's, be called the Cayuga Circuit; and that Caledonia, Seneca, Barker's, Anderson's, Bill's, York, Ballsville, and Mount Healy, be called the Caledonia Circuit.

XIV. That a case having occurred of a preacher discontinued by the last Conference having been employed on a Circuit during the year, in the absence of due examination and credentials, this Conference deems it its duty to express its strong disapprobation of such conduct, and prohibits all its preachers in charge from countenancing any such cases in future.

XV. That in future any minister neglecting to furnish a duly authenticated list of members to the Annual Conference shall pay a fine of \$5 to the Mission Fund.

XVI. That the Rev. J. Simpson write the address to the church in Canada next Conference.

XVII. That the Rev. W. Gundy write the address to the English Conference next year.

XVIII. That the time for holding the May District Meeting be left optional with those District meetings which cannot comply with the strict letter of the law.

XIX. That while this Conference disclaims any right or wish to interfere with the political opinions of any of our ministers or members, it cannot but regret that the Rev. N. C. Gowan, during the excitement of the last election, should have written a letter to a political adversary which this Conference deems intemperate, ill-judged, wanting in proper taste, and inconsistent with the moderation and dignity of a Christian minister; and the Conference strongly advises all our ministers to keep aloof from the public agitation of party politics.

XX. That this Conference reiterates its protest against that "sum of all villanies"—Slavery, as it exists in the United States, and earnestly prays that the slave may soon have extended to him the inestimable blessings of liberty.
