VOTES OF THANKS.

It was moved by Dr. McGregor, duly seconded, and unanimously resolved:

"That the thanks of this Synod be given:

- To the Christian friends of the town and neighbourhood of Pictou for their abundant hospitality, in entertaining the members; also, to the Committee of Arrangements, and especially to the Convener, for the manner in which they discharged their duties; and to the ministers and office-hearers of this Church, for the use of this building and committee rooms across the street during our meetings.
- 2. To the several Railway and Steamboat Companies, for their kindness in reducing the fares to and from Pictou."

It was agreed:

"That the thanks of the Synod be given to the Committee on Business, especially the Secretary, for the efficient manner in which they performed their work."

The minutes of this Sederunt were read and sustained.

CLOSING OF SESSION.

The Synod sang a portion of the hundred and twenty-second Psalm, after which the Moderator declared the Court adjourned, to meet in the First Presbyterian Church, Truro, on the last Tuesday of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine years, and at half-past seven o'clock in the evening, and closed the Session with the Benediction.
