To the Order Universal:

At the session of the Supreme Lodge held at Cincinnati, June, 1888 the following was adopted:

"That it be and it is hereby enacted, that the Tuesday following the second Sunday in June of each year be and is hereby set apart as the Memorial Day of the Order of Knights of Pythias; and that the subordinate lodges of the Order are hereby authorized and earnestly requested to meet in their respective localities upon said day in each year, whenever the same is practicable and convenient, for the purpose of decorating the graves of our departed brethren, and for the purpose of engaging in such services and exercises as may be in harmony and appropriate to the day and the

"And be it further enacted, that, whenever a subordinate lodge shall elect to perform such services upon a different day, they may select any day of the second week in June of each year."
