ST. JOHNS, Nfd., March 11. — With 3,500 men abroad the seal fishing fleet of 18 steamers will start tomorrow on its annual cruise to the sealing grounds. The date is two days later than last year and was fixed by an agreement entered into by all ships owners involved.

Because of the unusual number of immature seals killed last year it was deemed advisable to set back the date for sailing. Of the 18 ships, 14 will operate off the Labrador coast. The remaining four will work in the gulf of St. Lawrence.
